



## **2021 PRIDE PARADE RULES AND REGULATIONS**

The below is based on the ruling of the Cayman Islands Government on the 21<sup>st</sup> of July 2021.

### **PARADE RULES AND CONDUCT:**

1. All participants must have received their second vaccination dose by no later than **Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> July 2021** in order to participate in the parade.
2. There will be no carnival-type costumes (i.e. no exposed midriffs, no exposed chest areas, no exposed private parts, no short-shorts, no beads, no bikinis or swimwear, no indecent/obscene graphics or writing on clothing...) only approved pride-related accessories will be appropriate for the parade. Any accessories which are deemed inappropriate must be removed or the individual will not be permitted to participate in the parade.
3. There will be no physical interaction between registered participants and spectators. All registered participants in the parade must remain in the parade for its duration. There will be no room for discretion – any registered person who leaves the parade will not be permitted to rejoin the parade. Registered participants are not allowed to accept any articles from spectators or throw articles to spectators. Anyone who fails to comply commits an offence and will be removed from the parade as well as be liable on summary conviction to fine of ten thousand dollars and imprisonment for two years.
4. There will be no alcohol prior to or during the parade. Any inebriated persons will be asked to leave the parade.
5. Parade participants are required to refrain from improper conduct and public indecency including public displays of affection, whining or gyrating, exposing of private parts, public urination/defecation, etc.



6. The Royal Cayman Islands Police Service is the final authority and have the right to remove/arrest anyone in violation of rule number 3.
  
7. The Health Services Authority (HSA) will be located at the Public Beach on the 31<sup>st</sup> of July 2021 at 8:30 am to tag all participants. All registered participants are required to present their Identification and vaccination cards to Health Services Authority in order to be tagged prior to the March. Individuals can come to be tagged early and once completed individuals meet at 2 pm prior to the March individuals will be checked for the tags prior to entering the area and March.
  
8. As per regulations from Ministry of Health & Tourism children below the age of 12 are not permitted to participate in the Parade. Children 12 years of age and above will need to be vaccinated in order to participate in the March and must be accompanied by a parent who is registered for the parade.
